But most of them went to help at various locations near and far—to the Hunterdon Humane Shelter in Mount Pleasant; for painting and gardening at Finn Road Park, where their efforts were augmented by Union Township Mayor Michelle McBride, Committeeman Frank Mazza and Boy Scouts from Annandale Troop 200; to pick string beans for America's Grow-a-Row at Peaceful Valley Orchards; to paint furniture at

Hunterdon Developmental Center; to Woodland Wildlife Refuge to sweep out a barn and pull the eyes out of stuffed animals to make them safe for real animals to play with; to sing at Rolling Hills and Hunterdon Care Center nursing homes; to help Women at Work; and to join in Bridges Outreach in urban areas

After putting in several hours, the volunteers came back to the church for a feast of "signature hot dogs," 10 varieties named after the various projects, such as the "Grow-a-Row" served with steamed green beans, cucumber slices, shredded cabbage and ketchup.

Colleen Duerr, who was the chief organizer, said this is likely to become an annual event.

"It was spectacular," she said of the day. "I'm so proud to be a member of this church."
